- Substance abuse




Divorce rates - per year


Divorce rates - cumulative

- Preparation c.15,000 (1 in 15)
- Enrichment c.15,000 (1 in 800)
- Counselling c.40,000 (1 in 350)
- Overall -c.70,000 (1 in 200)
- Mostly at the beginning or end




What does support mean to us?


Experience, not expertise

- We share & point out patterns


